Risk- You can't manage what you can't measure

Speaker: Jack Jones, SVP of IT Risk, Huntington Bank

Date & Time: September 6th, 2011, 5.30pm

Overview:

The adage is true about the relationship between management and measurement. Unfortunately, misconceptions and bad practices have led many people to believe that risk can't be meaningfully measured. Others have adopted methods that purport to measure risk, but fall short in important ways. So where does that leave us from a management perspective?

In this session, Jack will discuss the foundation for effective risk measurement, and how that supports more effective management. It's not the rocket science you may imagine it to be.

About the Speaker:

Mr. Jones has been employed in technology for the past twenty-eight years, and has specialized in information security and risk management for twenty years. During this time, he's worked in the United States military, government intelligence, consulting, as well as the financial and insurance industries. Mr. Jones has over seven years of experience as a CISO, with five of those years at a Fortune 100 financial services company. His work there was recognized in 2006 when he received the 2006 ISSA Excellence in the Field of Security Practices award at that year's RSA conference. He is also the author and creator of the Factor Analysis of Information Risk (FAIR) framework.

In 2007, Mr. Jones was selected as a finalist for the Information Security Executive of the Year, Central United States, and judged the national Information Security Executive of the Year competition. From 2008 to 2009 he was an invited member of an international task force convened by ISACA to develop a standard framework for risk management, now referred to as RiskIT.

Currently, as SVP of IT Risk, Mr. Jones is responsible for the oversight and management of all IT-related risk at Huntington Bank. He also Chairs the Test Enhancement Subcommittee for ISACA's CRISC certification.

The PII and Mobile Security Seminar

Mark your calendar and register for this two-day course on Assessing Your Protection of Personal Identifiable Information (PII) Program and Security Mobile Assets and Applications. Earn **14 Continuing Education (CPE) credits** for this course.

Day 1

One of the unintended consequences of the information age is the availability of Personal Identifiable Information (PII). The combination of name, date of birth, and Social Security Number are the keys to the kingdom for the purposes of establishing false identity and fraud. Governmental entities have established a patchwork quilt of laws requiring custodians of personal information doing business in their locality to provide safeguards and assurance that PII is secure. The first day of this seminar will discuss PII scope and definitions; state and federal PII requirements; International considerations; and action plans for compliance, including building a framework for PII.

Day 2

Employees and customers are moving from the corporate offices to customer sites; working in trains, planes and automobiles, using smartphones and tablet computers to access every kind of sensitive corporate data. This is a revolution that is already happening and is likely to accelerate as mobile applications confer business advantages. Unsurprisingly, malware is on the move, too, with new generations of viruses, Trojans and worms targeting mobile devices as well as ubiquitous mobile services such as SMS messaging, and Bluetooth/WiFi connectivity. This course addresses the business advantages of mobile computing as well as the emerging issues of how to control mobile devices, protect corporate assets and maintain compliance with relevant legislation and data privacy standards. The second day of this seminar will discuss governance to control mobile assets; ensuring mobile devices and applications satisfy the components of the CIA triangle; security issues related to mobile applications and their development; issues related to Apple, Blackberry, Android, Windows, and Bluetooth platforms; authentication, encryption, and non-repudiation; multi-platform mobile environments; and provisioning, patching, and back-up in the mobile environment.

Instructor

The instructor, Jeff Kalwerisky is the Senior Director of Information Security and Technical Training at CPE Interactive. Jeff has specialized in information security, information risk management and IT auditing for over 20 years. He currently focuses on information risk, IT security governance and frameworks, and secure software development. He has held executive positions in information security and risk management with Accenture and Booz Allen Hamilton consulting firms. In both of these capacities, he has consulted with Fortune 100 companies and national governments. As manager of global security for VeriSign, Jeff was responsible for ensuring that affiliate companies in 30 countries adhered to VeriSign's military-grade security standards appropriate to a global certification authority, which he helped to design and deploy. Jeff was a partner with a major audit firm in South Africa and a consultant with PricewaterhouseCoopers. He has published security and audit guides, and has developed training courses throughout the USA and internationally on a wide range of technical topics.

Jeff is originally from South Africa, where he received a Bachelor of Science in Physics and Math, a Masters of Science in Computer Science from University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, and Masters in Finance and Auditing from the University of South Africa, Pretoria. He is a Chartered Accountant (SA) and Certified Information Systems Auditor.

COBIT 5 Public Comments

You have a wonderful and rare opportunity to have your voice heard, contribute to the profession and earn up to 10 free CPEs! Two COBIT 5 documents are available for public comment at www.isaca.org/cobit5exposure. The deadline for comments has been extended to **September 18 2011** so feedback can be incorporated from as many professionals as possible. These comments are extremely important, as they help ISACA validate the quality and acceptability of the COBIT 5 development work, which is critical to its position as a generally accepted reference source. All levels of participation are welcome, so you can choose to comment on all or specific parts of the draft documents.

COBIT 5 will be a major evolution of the globally recognized COBIT guidance, incorporating the most up-to-date thinking in enterprise governance and management techniques. This is a unique opportunity for you to be a vital part of guidance that is used and respected by many enterprises around the world.

ISACA has tried to make the review and comment process as efficient as possible. First, download the public exposure drafts for both the “COBIT 5: The Framework” and the “COBIT 5: Process Reference Guide” at www.isaca.org/cobit5exposure. After reviewing the documents, use the questionnaire on the same web page to provide feedback. To add more details, please use the feedback form on the same site.

How to Earn and Report CPE

How to report CPEs in your profile

CPEs are reported annually during the renewal process. CPEs earned in the current year may be entered in your profile once the next year's renewal period opens. Reporting of CPEs can be done online or by submitting the information on the annual renewal invoice.

To update CPE hours through the ISACA website, log on using your personalized log in credentials and follow the steps below.

Click on the **MY ISACA** tab at the top of the page

Click on the **MY CERTIFICATIONS** tab

Click on the **EDIT MY CPE Hours** link

The CPE reporting is located on the My Demographic, Certification CPE and Other Information tab. Scroll to the bottom of the page to view and edit the appropriate CPE fields. If you do not see a CPE section, CPE hours are not being accepted or you are not required to report CPEs yet.

Enter CPE hours – then click SAVE at the bottom of the page
